Shane Knuth notches up 17 years as an MP

KAP Member for Hill Shane Knuth notched up 17 years as an MP since being sworn in on February 7, 2004.

During this time, Mr Knuth has seen many highs and lows in the political arena and pointed out that over the last 10 years alone there has been more than 100 MPs voted in and out of the Queensland Parliament.

"Never in my wildest dreams would I have thought I would still be here as a State MP serving my seven terms in office," Mr Knuth said.

"I am absolutely proud to have represented three different electorates."

Mr Knuth is now in his second term as the Member for Hill.

"All that I have achieved would not have been possible if it weren't for the people in my electorate," he said.

"Thank you to all of those that have continued to lobby and bring to my attention the need for better roads, schools, hospitals and infrastructure.

"Without all of you continuing to advocate for your communities my job would not be possible."

Mr Knuth was first elected as the Member for Charters Towers in 2004 until 2009 when his electorate was abolished due to boundary redistributions in 2009, where he contested and won the seat of Dalrymple.

He represented the seat of Dalrymple, which stretched from Atherton to Moranbah, until 2017 when there was another boundary redistribution, and his seat was abolished once again.

In 2017, Mr Knuth ran for the seat of Hill and has been representing the people of the Cassowary Coast from Babinda to Tully and the Tablelands from Atherton to Mount Garnet, Irvinebank to Almaden.
